It's Getting Hot Out There!

but don't let it get hot in here!

Prevent Hyperthermia!

- On average, 37 children die from heatstroke inside hot vehicles each year in the US. A record number of **46 deaths** have occurred **in the last year!**
- The child is left in the car **unintentionally** in over half the cases of vehicular heatstroke.
- More than half of vehicular heatstroke deaths occur in children under 2 years of age.

Never leave infants or children in a parked car. Put something you'll need like your cell phone or purse in the back seat so you have to open the back door every time you park.





- Cracking the windows does not help slow the heating process or decrease the maximum temperature in a vehicle.
- If you see a child alone in a vehicle, get involved. Call 911 immediately. If the child seems hot or sick, get them out of the vehicle as quickly as possible.
