Prevent to Protect: Prevent Infections for Baby's Protection

To increase your chances of having a healthy baby:

Get vaccinated.

- Get the flu shot and the whooping cough vaccine.
- Become up-to-date with all vaccines before getting pregnant.

Prevent insect bites.

- Use insect repellent.
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants when outside.
- Consider avoiding travel to areas with Zika virus.

Practice good hygiene.

- Wash your hands often with soap and water.
- Avoid putting a young child's cup or pacifier in your mouth.

Talk to your healthcare provider.

- Ask about how you can prevent infections, such as Zika virus.
- Discuss how to prevent sexually transmitted infections.



Every four and a half minutes, a baby is born with a birth defect about 120,000 year. Birth а defects are the most common cause of death in the first year of life and the second most common cause of death children aged one to four years.
