## What Does UV Mean?

UV is short for ultraviolet. It's a type of electromagnetic radiation coming from the sun... or tanning beds. Our atmosphere blocks most of the sun's rays, but the ones that do make it here contribute to skin cancer and blindness.





# Did you know...?

Your eyes can get sunburned too. It's called ultraviolet keratitis. Repeated occurrences leave you at greater risk for developing cataracts.

## What You Can Do

- Buy UV-blocking sunglasses.
- Wear your sunglasses outside or in the car, especially between the hours of 10am and 4pm.
- Check the UV index (epa.gov/sunsafety): a higher number means more exposure to UV rays.
- Use sunscreen on long road trips or outside even if it's cloudy!
- Re-apply sunscreen every TWO hours.
- Wear a hat, or use an umbrella at outside parties or on the beach.
- Ask your doctor if any of your current prescriptions increase your sensitivity to UV rays. **Information Sources**
