In the early 1990's, the Palmetto Conservation Foundation and a small group of visionaries imagined a trail that would stretch across South Carolina from mountains to sea. With that vision in mind, they went to work creating what we now know today as the Palmetto Trail. The Trail now consists of 29 passages and over 360 miles of completed trail.
